Speed Watch

Jason Lemm gave his report; explained recent operation re speeding and recent wave of burglaries.

There was a speed check on the 13th Feb 2013 along the A259. Early warning spotters were in place.

3 motorist were pulled in for speeding and given full checks as well as warnings, no tickets issued.

4 fixed penalty tickets were issued for not wearing seat belts.

I enforced – use of mobile

1 driver was issued a ticket for speeding over 41mls

Links in the area. PCSO Karen Hopewell is based in Fishbourne, she explained that as part of her role she will be proactive in making links between Fishbourne and Southbourne.

Information Day -On Thursday the 14th March, Fishbourne and Bosham are holding an open day to inform the local people about SIDS – this will be held in St Johns Church.

It is hoped that by bring awareness to the local community that this will produce further volunteers.

There will be posters going out about the event and hopefully advertising through Spirit FM and Facebook.

There will also be an aim to inform the community that Southbourne have mobile SIDS

SIDS was discussed – Confirmed in hand- pending batteries, they will be placed in and around Southbourne. Jim talked about the risk of the batteries going flat, Jason clarified that there is a fault and can be accidently being turned on and if placed face down can cause a flat battery.

Parking

Jim brought the groups attention to the placement of a track monitoring system, this could be found towards the end of Stein Road, near South Lane- The group agreed that this was a County initiative, this measurement was possibly in place around the pending '20 is plenty'.

The parking enforcement officer in the District County Council is Craig Adfield.

School Parking This continues to be an issue, particularly in and around Lodgeburry Close. . Letters have recently gone out to parents reminding them to be considerate of parking near the school.

Jason is continuing to monitor the situation and is having an on-site meeting with the parking officer.

Burglaries.

There have recently been further incidences of burglaries in and around the area. The Sussex Brewery was broken into, as well as 2 houses in Jan/Feb.

There has also been a group of Hampshire lads identified who have been causing some of the burglaries. 2 have been remanded in custody.

Travellers The issues of the travellers were discussed , it was noted that Travellers are moving between Bosham, Emsworth and Southbourne . They are currently at Brimfast Lane in Selsey, where there is an eviction notice to move them on. Some of the traveller's children are attending local schools- therefore it was felt that they were likely to remain in the area.

School Lane – two permanent sites for the use of travellers. Planning permission was applied for and refused – there is currently an appeal.

Layby traders-

This continues to be an on-going issue, however has not been a priority due to other issues being addressed. Hampshire appears to have a bylaw that prevents the occurrence of layby traders.

Cyclist. Graham identified that there have been cyclist without lights in the area, in addition they are also wearing dark clothing.- it was also acknowledged that there are some very good cyclists.

PCSO. Jason agreed to follow up.

Tesco's. Robert brought the attention to the group re Tesco's deliveries and the risk to pedestrians in and around the area of the shop; they are also putting up parking bollards to enable the lorries to park. They are causing an obstruction to the drop curb, particularly between the hours of 8.00 am and 3.00 pm this causes a particular risk, due to increased traffic around school times. PCSO. Jason to follow up.

Motorbikes – It was noted that this continues to be an on-going issue, however the riders have recently received a warning under section 59 – it is thought that this has had a positive outcome of reducing this antisocial behaviour.

Morgan's Furniture Store. Tim Horn from the DCC has been monitoring the impact of anti-social noise and admissions. It was noted by Jim, that the noise has been reduced. This will be continued to be monitored.
